

JUNIOR COMPETITION EVENT DELIVERY PLAN – COVID-19

The Government has published detailed [guidance on organising outdoor sport and physical activity participation events](#), which can help venues, officials and organisers facilitate events such as recreational competitions, social play events and club nights.

Before the event	<p><i>This document is to be read in conjunction with the LTC RA updated 18th October</i></p> <p><i>Prior to the event we will email full details including safety measures required and request confirmation that these have been read and explained to the players</i></p> <p><i>The courts are outside, and no enclosed spaces will be available during the event</i></p> <p><i>All players will be asked to arrive at specified time – spectators are not permitted</i></p> <p><i>On arrival we will brief the players, enforcing the distancing rules. Sharing of raquets is not permitted</i></p> <p><i>We will ask parents to confirm that none of their households are displaying signs of COVID (or have done in last 14 days)</i></p>		
During the event	<p><i>We have a hand sanitising station in place and all players will have to use it prior to play and during play.</i></p> <p><i>Parents are not allowed to spectate</i></p> <p><i>We have two adults managing the event effecting a 1 to 4 ratio which is manageable and means we can speak directly to players if the forget the social distancing rules.</i></p> <p><i>The clubhouse will be closed throughout.</i></p> <p><i>There will be sufficient time allowed between the two group sessions, to allow first group time to exit before second session can begin. They will be reminded not to enter the court until all the previous session children have left.</i></p> <p><i>We will have separate batch of balls for each group.</i></p> <p><i>If it rains during the session, play will continue for the remainder of the session if deemed safe to do so. Players will be advised to bring waterproofs & umbrellas to keep dry until they are collected or leaving on their own to go home.</i></p>		
After the event	<p><i>We will stagger the players as they leave to maintain distancing</i></p> <p><i>Players, Parents & Guardians will be asked to go straight home and not congregate after the competition</i></p>		

Consider the following in your delivery plan:

- Droplet transmission and aerosol generation: The risk associated with each action in an activity based on duration and proximity of participants
- Fomite transmission: The risk associated with the handling and transfer of equipment in the activity
- Population: The number of participants likely to take part in the proposed activity plus known risk factors of participants with underlying health conditions or high-risk groups, who wish to participate
